SUBJECT

: Hatches

- 1. I have been somewhat dismayed at the report that there would be little or no interchangeability of hatches between the different aircraft and we would therefore he compelled to procure one hatch of each of possibly four types for each strengt. This would require procurement of eighty batches without spares.
- 2. I discussed this briefly with Kelly Johnson on the telephone today. He accures me that the hatches are machined to be interchangeable. it may be difficult to achieve complete interchangeability but it should be entirely feasible to render a particular set of hatches interchangeable as among the five aircraft of one Detachment. This should obviate the necessity of baying the full number of batches that would otherwise be required.
- 3. Kelly also advised me that he and have worked out a hatch design that would do for A-i, A-2 and B. Another hatch would be required for use for the C configuration. The already existing solid hatches will be medified to be used with the meteorological configuration. On this conception it would seem to me that we should procure as fellows:

Obviously this would be a much more manageable arrangement. i would appreciate if you would confirm with Red Scott the combined A-1 pins A-2 plus B hatch if it is feasible and then confirm in due time with Lockhood if the necessary degree of interchangeability can be achieved. Since the solid hatches aircody exist. I doubt if there is any possibility of economising on this item.
