On 27 Movember 1953 (the date on which the shipment of effects from a foreign post of duty to the United States was limited to 3,000 pounds) many employees had at their posts of assignment, or elsewhere, effects in excess of the then new limitation. The first travel authorization issued after 27 Movember 1953, to an employee who was assigned to a foreign post of duty on 27 November 1953, which authorizes transportation of effects will impose the weight limitation current at the time of shipment so far as movement of effects to the next foreign post of duty is concerned, but it will also constitute an automatic extra authorization to transport to his designated place of residence in the United States an emount of effects not exceeding the difference between his entitle-  $25 \times 1 \text{\AA}$ nd the amount authorized ment under the provisions of 10 for movement to his next foreign post of duty. If the next travel authorization issued to the employee is incident to reassignment to a duty station in the United States, he may ship on this 25X1/authorization the amount to which he is entitled under the provisions The effect of this provision is intended to be retroactive to 27 November 1953.
