PROGRESS REPORT OF THE GEOGRAPHIC AREA, ORR

MONTH OF DECEMBER 1956

OFFICE OF THE CHIEF, GEOGRAPHIC RESEARCH

A. Accomplishments and Coordination Activities

1. Production in the Geographic Research Area generally decreased during the month, reflecting the inroads of holidays, leave-taking, and lessened activity elsewhere in CIA. Requirements related to Hungary continued to occupy the Geography and Cartography Divisions. A Geographic Intelligence Memorandum on Kashmir was produced coincident with the visit of Mr. Nehru to the United States. Additional activity of significance included studies and conferences on Antarctic intelligence and the photographic support of clandestine operations.

2. The Cartography Division completed 46 maps and charts, of which 22 were for ORR, 3 for OGI, 4 for OSI, 5 in support of NIS, 8 for the DD/S, and 4 for the Department of State. A total of 32 projects were initiated, all of which were for Agency components; this is the first month in many years that the Division did not initiate a new project for the Department of State. The NIS Map Coordinator received 14 color proofs and 8 final maps during the month, leaving 19 finals and 1 color proof in reproduction. The Special Support Branch completed 37 projects and accepted requests for 39.

3. The Map Library Division received 1,902 map sheets and 664 related publications from foreign sources. Of these, 37% were retained in CIA, 28% were sent to AMS, 17% to the Library of Congress, and 13% to the Office of Geography, Department of the Interior. Items of particular interest included 17 new oblast maps; a 1954 city plan of Riga; telephone directories for Minsk and Kishinev; a 1956 gazetteer of Rumania; a street guide for Bucharest; 6 Chinese atlases; a 1956 map of Yugoslavia showing administrative divisions; and a new political map of India. A total of 15,633 map sheets were distributed in answer to 960 requests.

4. The Photo Intelligence Division completed seven Photographic Intelligence Memoranda (GP/I-226, Gorkiy Airframe Plant #21; GP/I-228, Saratov Airframe Plant; GP/I-229, Rostov Aircraft Plant; GP/I-230, Voronezh Aircraft Plant; GP/I-231, Kharkov Aircraft Plant #135; GP/I-232, Southeast China Situation; and GP/I-233, Field Artillery Concentration in SE China); and three CS evaluations.

25X1C 5. The Geography Division completed two Geographic Intelligence Reports (GR-135, Evasion Geography [redacted] and GR-141, [redacted]; the NIS Section 19, Chapter I on Finland; one GM (GM-2, The Kashmir Question); and three G/I memoranda.

6. Further presentations of the Industrial Photo Interpretation Course are temporarily suspended by pressure of work. Consideration is being given to a revised and lengthened course providing backgrounds in geographic and tactical photo interpretation as well as industrial photo interpretation.

7. Recommendations on ORR policy with regard to weekend key-personnel duty were presented to St/A. The policy as stated in ORR Regulation R50-14/1 is felt to need clarification and strengthening if there is to be adequate guarantee of the coverage of essential ORR functions.

8. Tables of organization and position classifications within the Cartography Division are currently under critical review, with the objective of securing better conformance of staffing patterns with the distribution of Division workloads and responsibilities. Results of the review will be presented formally in the near future.

9. The failure of several important coordinations between the Geography Division and elements of the Economic Research Area during 1956 points up the increasing need for formal ORR policy on the coordination of research. The present situation, in which cooperation is fundamentally dependent on individual whim, is unhealthy and encourages the duplication of projects, divergence of viewpoints, and a haphazard rather than cumulative advance of essential knowledge. The problem will be studied further and specific recommendations developed.

25X1A 10. The Chief of the Geography Division and other Division personnel concerned with the project [redacted] met with [redacted] of DD/P and his people to discuss the question of more selective priorities and workload. [redacted] will report back on the matter.

A meeting of the Arctic Working Group was held during the month, at which [redacted] described the activities of the Geography Division and related activities of other Geographic Area components that are contributory to Arctic Research. Two sub-groups were established: one to work up the DD/I priority objectives on the Soviet Arctic; the second to set up a "clearing operation" for Arctic information.

12. The Staff on Soviet Mapping Intelligence, D/GG, concentrated upon Antarctic activities during the month, including the development of Agency views on the US Outline Plan of Operations, preparation of a briefing for the DCI on problems on US - Antarctic planning (G/I-210);

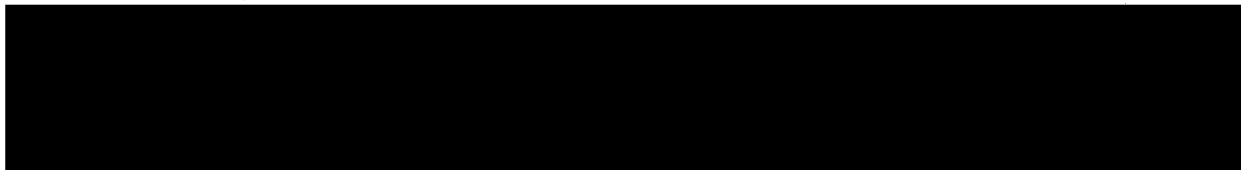

the preparation of an article on Soviet activities for the Current Intelligence Weekly, and the briefing of the OCI representative on Antarctic activities for the DD/I luncheon meeting of the AD's.

13. The Map Library Division furnished O/TR with appropriate maps for the new course on "The Use of Maps for Intelligence Purposes". Samples of various map projections, scales, grids and other symbols were selected for presentation during the course and quantities of other maps were provided for class exercises.

14. Microfilming of Geography Division files for Vital Storage purposes commenced during the month. A system has been achieved which will make the recorded information completely accessible.

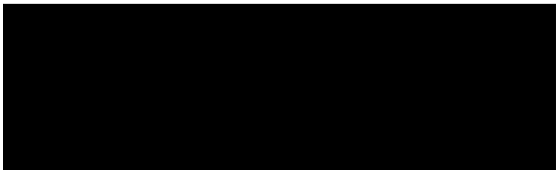

MONTHLY REPORT FOR THE CARTOGRAPHY DIVISION

Month of December 1956

A. Summary of Cartographic Production and Accomplishments

1. Thirty-two projects were initiated during the month of December in the Cartography Division, 7 were for ORR, 5 for OCI, 1 for the IG's Office, 11 for contributions to the NIS from CIA, and 8 for the DD/S. For the first time in many years the Division did not initiate a new project from the Department of State for an entire month. During the month the Division completed 46 projects, 22 for ORR, 3 for OCI, 4 for OSI, 5 in support of NIS, 8 for the DD/S, and 4 for the Department of State. Thirty-seven projects remained in reproduction as of the first of January which represents a considerable increase during the past 30 days. As will be noted in the Branch reports, considerable inroads were made into the backlog of work with production for ORR being particularly heavy.

2. The NIS Map Coordinator received from reproduction 14 color proofs and 8 final maps during December, leaving 19 finals and 1 color proof in the reproduction plant at the close of the reporting period.

3. The Special Support Branch accepted requests for 39 projects and completed 37. A considerable backlog has developed in this Branch during December and with the absence of [REDACTED] who will be on military leave in January, it will probably be necessary to assign additional support from Building 11.

MONTHLY REPORT FOR THE MAP LIBRARY DIVISION

December 1956

1. Summary of Statistics for Receipts, Processing, and Disbursements of the Map Library Division, December 1956 (on next page).

2. The tapering off of the urgent calls for maps of the Near East, together with the advent of the Christmas season, contributed to a decreased activity in the Map Library, in most parts. This was reflected in numbers of requests for service, as well as in sheets issued.

3. [REDACTED] OTR, was furnished appropriate maps for the new course, The Use of Maps for Intelligence Purposes. Samples of various map projections, scales, grids, and other symbols were selected for presentation during the course and quantities of other maps were provided for class exercises. In addition, Mr. Barnes, the new Publications Procurement Officer for Moscow, was briefed on the needs of the Map Library and was given a selection of CIA and AMS maps for the use of the Embassy at Moscow.

4. An element of service and use of the Map Library not reflected in the statistics is found in the use made of the collections by ACIC research personnel. They are required, in the course of their research, to fully exploit the Map Library, and frequently do all of their work in the collections, not borrowing the maps for use in their own offices. For the most part they are interested in recent, large scale special subject maps and recent city plans which have annotations and installations.

5. The review of map holdings covering the U.S.S.R. was completed, and 425 special subject maps, 650 series sheets were selected for forwarding to the Depository.

6. Procurement operations continue to yield additional Russian and Satellite materials. Those received in December include seventeen new oblast maps, a 1954 city plan of Riga, telephone directories for Minsk and Kishinev, a 1956 gazetteer of Rumania, a street guide for Bucharest, six Chinese atlases, a 1956 map of Yugoslavia showing administrative divisions, and a new political map of India. The gazetteer of Rumania contained an excellent map which is currently being reproduced in quantity for Library servicing requirements.

A. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

1. Projects and Reports

a. Division efforts continue to focus on top priority projects for the DCI, DD/I, and DD/P areas. Seven Photographic Intelligence Memoranda and three CS evaluations were issued. Many substantive and technical consultations were held. Work accomplished is noted below by supported unit.

b. DCI, DD/I, and AD/RR: Special support was provided on Projects 70.159 and 70.210.

c. ORR, Geographic Area: Work continues on a series of uncontrolled mosaics in support of Project 72.204 concerning [REDACTED]. Work is underway on Project 72.237 [REDACTED].

d. ORR, Economic Area: Work continues on Southeast China Studies and one situation report (GP/I-232) and a study of Field Artillery Concentrations, Southeast China Area (GP/I-233) were completed. Metrical analysis was completed on Soviet Airframe Plants at Gorkiy (GP/I-226), Voronez (GP/I-230), Kharkov (GP/I-231), Rostov (GP/I-229), and Saratov (GP/I-228). Work continues on a study of Soviet Rail Lines (Project 70.252). Planning began on the utilization of special photographic materials of interest to D/S that will be received for analysis from DD/P. Project 72.229, an analysis of Hainan Iron Ore Facilities, was cancelled for lack of additional information.

Briefings and Debriefings

In addition to some of the more routine meetings, personnel of FE-4, DD/P, were briefed on the Far East Branch needs and capabilities for fulfilling their requirements on Vietnam; a 2-day briefing was given to Mr. Ed Vogel of AMS for his procurement mission to the UK and Scandinavia; Mr. Biggs was briefed prior to his return to South America as Geographic Attaché; Messrs. Rogers and True visited Miss Rhea Blue, OIR, State, to discuss her recent trip to the Far East and South Asia, particularly as regards her observations in Sikkim and Nepal.



B. Progress of Work Under Way

The following are brief characterizations of work under way in the individual branches and staffs during December:

Far East Branch: Intelligence production during the month featured completion and issuance of CIA/RR-GM-2, The Kashmir Question. Final contributor review was given to Chapter IX, NIS 99, Philippine Islands. Substantial progress was made on the GG/F contribution to Chapter IX, NIS 41A<sup>M</sup>, North Korea, the Tibet phase of [redacted] and the Regional Analysis of Northeast Thailand. Considerable time was devoted to problems of coordination with A/F, including our review of Chapter V of their contribution to NIE 13-57 and an appraisal of their rather scathing criticism of our paper on Collectivization of Chinese agriculture. A considerable block of time was expended in annual leave over the holiday season. The arrival of [redacted] in the Branch provided welcome help with clerical and semi-professional chores that had been consuming an unduly large amount of professional time.

USSR Branch: Work progress in the Branch was good despite a high incidence of sick and annual leave and time spent in housekeeping activities (the preparation of files for microfilming, review and reorganization of regional books and periodicals, and map holdings). The Soviet Arctic, CIA/RR-G-15 went to Reproduction. [redacted] in answer to [redacted] was completed and transmitted to the requester. The Volga-Urals Regional Study (in response to a request and outline discussed with M/P) was completed and forwarded to Ch/G for review. Work continues on Soviet Railroads, [redacted] and Novaya Zemlya. Revision of the Territorial-Administrative Divisions of the USSR, which will include a number of new items, is nearing completion. Subjects are being surveyed for possible GM articles.

Western Hemisphere Branch: The month was devoted almost entirely to two projects -- PN 06.1470, Assessment of Petroleum Potential in Latin America, and PN 66.1257, Status of Boundaries between Latin American countries. The CIA contribution to Chapter IX, NIS 90, Argentina was started. [REDACTED] continued his Spanish course in the Office of Training.

Near East/Africa Branch: The month involved considerable "backing and filling" on two GM's, one of which (on Syria) was finally cancelled after rewrite and the other (Algeria-Libya) tabled for further developments. A third GM (on Israel) has been written and revised and is now in D/GG review. GM-1, which was issued in November, was defended in a discussion with OCI. A draft of Section 19, NIS 27, Turkey, has been completed. The Branch examined in some detail for AD/RR a plan for water development in Israel.

Editing and Review Staff: The general lack of understanding of the GM problem shows up clearly in the work of the Editing and Review Staff for December. The only new report received during the month was CIA/RR-GM-2, The Kashmir Question. On the other hand, the Editor-in-Chief spent a total of 21 hours in planning, which was devoted almost exclusively to proposed GM's. As a result, GG/R has been able to catch up on much of its back work -- not a wholesome situation if continued.

Staff on Soviet Mapping Intelligence: Effort was concentrated upon Antarctic activities, including the development of Agency views on the U.S. Outline Plan of Operations, preparing a briefing for the DCI on problems on U.S.-Antarctic planning (G/I-210), and the preparation of an article on Soviet activities for the Current Intelligence Weekly. In addition, the OCI representative was briefed on Antarctic activities for the DD/I luncheon meeting of the AD's. Other activities included the review and reissue of G/E-55 (Comments on the Soviet Request to Observe the October 1958 Solar Eclipse from the Tokelau Islands), the revision of a conference summary of the ATIC-CIA post-symposium discussion on strengthening U.S. interests in IGY gravity activities, and participation in the briefing of the PPO to Moscow.

Coordination Staff: Coordination of Chapter IX of NIS 4, Netherlands, is well under way, although the coordinator has had to devote considerable time to other projects. Work on NIS 12<sup>M</sup>, Finland, is progressing according to schedule. Work on the latter was held in abeyance for a part of December, however, because the coordinator was also assigned to the Section 19 for the same area. Although contributions for NIS 27, Turkey, were due 15 October, the Army contribution has not been received and, as a result, the coordination process has been delayed. Delays in receipt of Army contributions to both Chapter IX and Section 19 of Chapter I are making fulfillment of our commitments increasingly difficult. In addition to that for Turkey mentioned above, the contribution to NIS 41B<sup>M</sup>, South Korea, due on 27 November, has not been received. Section 19 of NIS 12, Finland, which was due on 15 November and later promised for 7 December, was received 20 December; the deadline to OBI on this coordinated section was the end of December, which was met because of overtime spent by the Coordination Staff.

XI. RELATIONSHIPS OUTSIDE THE GEOGRAPHIC AREA

The Coordination Staff reports that a meeting was held at OBI to discuss the ACIC graphics in Chapter IX. Present at the meeting were [redacted] of the Coordination Staff, Messrs. Cavanagh, Sweet, and Monchristian of ACIC, and [redacted] of OBI. The discussion covered ways and means of expediting the correction of graphics. A common understanding was reached on several discrepancies that have existed between the type, format, and coloring of the ACIC graphics and those submitted by other agencies.

Ensign Thomas Penchoen, ONI, discussed with the Coordination Staff the source material used in the preparation of Chapter IX, with particular emphasis on the Chapter IX of Austria. He was especially interested in the part of the chapter dealing with aerial photography. The Ensign was given information on the method of preparation of the Chapter and a copy of the Chapter Outline, with names of contributors, and was referred to appropriate agencies for further assistance.

The Arctic Working Group met on 7 December, at which [redacted] described the activities of D/GG and related activities of other components of the Geographic Area that are contributory to Arctic Research. Another sub-group was established to set up a "clearing operation" for arctic information with the stipulation that this "clearing operation" would involve no substantive responsibility or authority, and [redacted] will serve with this group. The Chief of the Far East Branch reports that the relationship between A/F and GG/F in 1955 and 1956 has been costly. Mutual non-publication through mutual non-concurrence seems the costliest possible way of operating. In the project on the regional analysis of the economy of Communist China and the related Chapter V of the ORR contribution to NIE 13-57, as well as in the case of the GG/F paper on collectivization, it is felt that A/F violated the most obvious and elementary rules of coordinating research effort. In the case of the former, they chose to ignore GG/F's contribution and offers of assistance and proceeded to present us with a finished copy of the ORR contribution to NIE 13-57 with a request for "coordination" (actually concurrence) with Chapter V -- a concurrence which that branch was unable to give. The consequent necessity for major revision of Chapter V could have been avoided by proper working level coordination during the research phase of the study.

In the case of the collectivization paper, GG/F's efforts to achieve an informal working level coordination of the research with A/F analysts were met by a prolonged lack of responsiveness, followed -- when pressed for a reply -- by a scathing criticism of the draft, returned through

high level supervisory channels. Although the project has now lost most of its value, due to the excessive time that has elapsed, GC/F still believes that the differences could have been ironed out and the paper could have made a real contribution had A/F been willing to participate in a genuine working level coordination.

It is recommended that increased official recognition be given at some higher supervisory level or levels to the desirability of coordination of research effort between D/A and D/GG analysts and to the necessity for cooperative working-level relationships in achieving this coordination.
