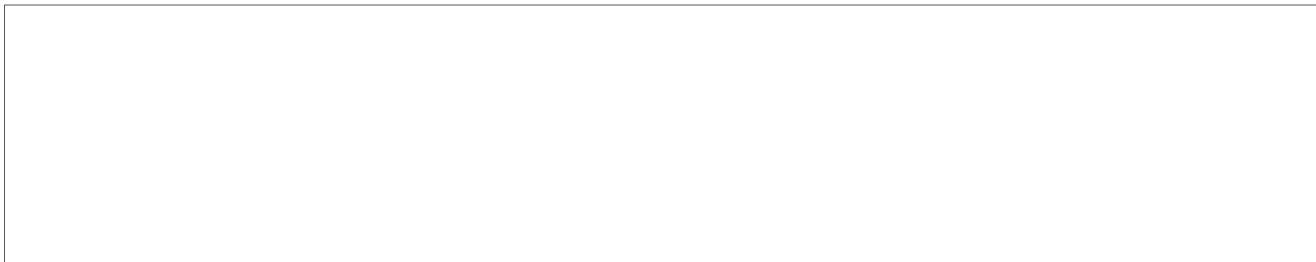

Talked with Boyd Crawford, Staff Administrator of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, who requested that the DCI brief the Committee in executive session on world affairs. The Committee will meet for this purpose on December 4 and the Secretary of State and Secretary of Defense are also being requested to appear. (See Memo to DCI)

In the course of conversation with William Darden and Kenneth Belieu of the Senate Armed Services Committee there was mentioned a source of scientific intelligence on Russia which the Committee was looking into. All of the details have been furnished in a memorandum of this date to the AD/SI.
