An apparent discrepancy exists between the second and last sentences of the paragraph. The existance of small scale subsistance furming certainly recognizes the right to erop the land if not comership itself. Furthermore the possible interpretations of the last sentence make comment difficult.

- d. Tatever is meant by modernization we do not believe it is wise in all cases to change the present system of land tenure. For instance in the hot wet tro les it is not profitable, without capital for fertilizer, to cultivate the same piece of land for several years.

A warning should be included of the danger of improving health conditions without also providing birth control information or providing food for the increasing population.
