### Services Division (D/S)

1. The Services Division is responsible for producing all-source intelligence on the services sector of the Soviet Bloc economy, for coordinating intelligence production in this field within the US Government, and for contributing, within its field of responsibility, to national estimates.

2. The services sector includes generally:

- a. Managerial mechanisms of the economic ministries
- b. International trade and finance and domestic trade
- c. Transportation
- d. Labor and manpower
- e. Communications
- f. Construction of fixed installations and construction materials
- g. Certain specialized service organizations.

### Communications Branch (S/COM)

1. The Communications Branch is responsible for producing all-source economic intelligence on the facilities and activities of organized systems of communications of the Soviet Bloc, for coordinating such intelligence production within the US Government, and for contributing, within its field of responsibility, to national estimates.

2. Communications includes generally:

- a. Telecommunications facilities (landline and radio)
- b. Telecommunications activities (telephone conversations, telegrams, etc.)
- c. Radiobroadcasting
- d. Functional services (aeronautical, police, marine, etc.)
- e. Radio location and control facilities
- f. Communications analysis
- g. Postal service.

3. The Soviet ministerial responsibilities generally are:
  - a. Ministry of Communications
  - b. Those political or administrative subdivisions of other Soviet ministries which are concerned with telecommunications.

Transportation Branch (S/TR)

1. The Transportation Branch is responsible for producing all-source economic intelligence on the transportation activities and facilities, other than military aircraft and pipelines, of the Soviet Bloc, for coordinating such intelligence production within the US Government, and for contributing, within its field of responsibility, to national estimates.

2. Transportation includes generally:

- a. Rail, water (ocean & river), air, and road transportation facilities
- b. Character, magnitude, and direction of traffic via the various media
- c. Transportation equipment and equipment markings
- d. Routes and capacity of routes.

3. The Soviet ministerial responsibilities generally are:

- a. Ministry of Land Transport
- b. Ministry of Sea and River Transport
- c. Chief Directorate of the Civil Air Fleet (Ministry of Defense)
- d. Administrative subdivisions of other Soviet Ministries which are concerned with transportation.

Trade Branch (S/TR)

1. The Trade Branch is responsible for producing all-source economic intelligence on international and domestic trade and international finance of the Soviet Bloc, for coordinating such intelligence production within the US Government, and for contributing, within its field of responsibility, to national estimates.

2. Trade and finance include generally:
  - a. East-West trade
  - b. Intra-Bloc trade
  - c. Trade agreements
  - d. Soviet trade policy
  - e. Soviet Bloc balance of payments and other external financial activities
  - f. Domestic trade
3. The Soviet ministerial responsibilities generally are:
  - a. Ministry of Internal and Foreign Trade
  - b. Ministry of Finance
  - c. Administrative subdivisions of other Soviet Ministries which are concerned with international or domestic trade, international finance, and consumer services.

Construction Branch (S/CST)

1. The Construction Branch is responsible for producing all-source economic intelligence on the construction of fixed installations and the production of construction materials within the Soviet Bloc, for coordinating such intelligence production within the US Government, and for contributing, within its field of responsibility, to national estimates.
2. Construction includes generally:
  - a. Construction costs, methods, capabilities, materials and design standards of constructed fixed installations
  - b. The production of construction materials except timber
3. The Soviet ministerial responsibilities generally are:
  - a. Ministry of Construction
  - b. State Construction Committee
  - c. Ministry of Construction Materials Industry
  - d. Administrative subdivisions of other Soviet Ministries which are concerned with construction and construction materials.

Organizations Branch (S/OG)

1. The Organizations Branch is responsible for producing all-source economic intelligence on the economic organizations, key personalities, and industrial management techniques of the Soviet Bloc, for coordinating such intelligence production within the US Government, and for contributing, within its field of responsibility, to national estimates.

2. Organizations includes generally:

- a. Economic organizations
- b. Key personalities
- c. Trade union and Communist Party organization
- d. Planning organizations
- e. Industrial management techniques and organization
- f. Mobilization agencies and civil defense (except strategic stockpiling).

3. The Soviet ministerial responsibilities generally are:

- a. Ministry of State Control
- b. Gosplan
- c. Mobilization agencies and civil defense organizations
- d. Economic functions of non-economic ministries
- e. Administrative subdivisions of other Soviet Ministries which are concerned with organization, industrial management, and economic control.

Labor and Manpower Branch (S/L)

1. The Labor and Manpower Branch is responsible for producing all-source economic intelligence on population, manpower, education, and public information of the Soviet Bloc, for coordinating such intelligence production within the US Government, and for contributing, within its field of responsibility, to national estimates.

2. Labor and manpower include generally:

- a. Population
- b. Labor skills and education

- c. Wages, hours, conditions of work
  - d. Productivity
  - e. Public information (press, publishing, radiobroadcasting)
  - f. Standard of living
  - g. Consumer services
3. The Soviet ministerial responsibilities generally are:
- a. Ministry of Culture
  - b. Ministry of Justice
  - c. Ministry of Finance
  - d. Central Statistical Administration
  - e. Ministry of Health
  - f. Administrative subdivisions of other Soviet ministries which are concerned with population, manpower, education, and public information.

Special Services Organizations Branch (S/SO) \*

1. The Special Service Organizations Branch is responsible for producing all-source economic intelligence on the activities of those Soviet organizations which are concerned with regional development of the USSR, for coordinating such intelligence production within the US Government, and for contributing, within its field of responsibility, to national estimates.

2. Special Service Organizations include generally:

- a. Chief Directorate of the Northern Sea Route
- b. Dalstroy
- c. Arctic Institute
- d. Other regional organizations
