Coordination of CSM on Hungarian Attempt to Conceal Military Buildup REFERENCE: Your means, 2 May 1955

- I. While the wide variances between ORR estimates and recent Hungarian official announcements raise the possibility that the latter are falsified, the two suggested explanations appear rather questionable. In particular, the second explanation seems completely out of line with what we know about the relationship between the USGR and its various European Satellites. As for the first explanation, it is noted that ORR estimated a 10% decline in production by defense industry. This is consistent with a decline in USSR military expenditures as a part of the New Course.
- 2. The two OWR estimates for which this division is responsible, coment and bricks, are based primarily up on 1954 plans and trend projections from announced actual production for prior years. The responsible branch knows no reason why 1954 actual production should have been so far beneath both 1954 plans and 1953 actual production. In fact, a large new coment plant was scheduled to start production in 1954. On the other hand, it is possible that labor unrest or difficulties arising out of the New Course eight have had this result.
- 3. It is noted that the official announcement also spoke of an originally scheduled 4.5% increase in industrial output. If it were possible to confirm that this was the plan, it would support the announced schual increase.
- 4. If the amounced figures were false, the question would arise of whom the Hungarian Government was trying to decrive. It is at least conceivable that an amouncement that neavy industry production had declined might represent an attempt to discredit the "New Course" within Hungary.

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
