Subject: Interrogation of Returning Attaches

1. [redacted] has suggested that ambassadors and ministers who are returning from areas where common intelligence requirements are particularly urgent, be interrogated under the auspices of the Central Intelligence Group. If representatives of all IAB agencies were invited in each case, he believed that mutual benefit would result to the agencies and in economy of time to the Chief of Mission. I concur in his suggestions and have designated [redacted] (CIG, Extension 2860) to work out the details with [redacted] and with your agencies.

2. It occurs to me that it would be advantageous to all agencies to extend these arrangements to include returning military, naval and air attaches. It appears that these interrogations can be held in the CIG Presentation Room, (Central Building, 2430 "E" Street, N. W.) and that attendance by IAB agencies and CIG would have to be limited to about 10 persons each, because of space limitations. Each agency would be notified sufficiently far in advance, in order that they may prepare any desired questions to be asked.
