MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Advisory Council

SUBJECT: Intelligence Support for the Voice of America with
regard to Soviet Jamming

REFERENCE: Recent replies from Army, Navy and Air Force on
above subject

What do you think of submitting to the NSI a memorandum along
the following lines:

1. The Report on the above subject dated 2 June, compiled by
the Ad Hoc Committee, was approved by all members of the IAC. The
Air Force's approval listed comments.
2. The Pentagon agencies, however, have not approved of the
transmitting arrangements you submitted for concurrence on 21 July 1950,
wherein you suggested that CIA undertake the monitoring of the jamming
(Recommendation 3 of the Report) as a service of common concern.
3. I suggest that you modify as necessary the proposed memo-
randum of 21 July by eliminating the first clause about a unanimous
opinion of the IAC in Paragraph 4 and add thereto, in new paragraphs
or as enclosures, the Army, Air Force and revised Navy comments on
their desires that this matter be handled by USFIB and AFSA instead
of by CIA. Then the NSC can decide whether it wishes to have this
matter handled by the military or by CIA. The State Department did
not strongly support our stand so, in USFIB, would probably switch to
the side of the military.
4. The Report, of course, could be submitted without the recom-
mendations in Paragraphs 4-7 of the proposed memorandum of 21 July,
and with a statement to the effect that there is no agreement among
CIA and the Pentagon Intelligence Agencies on how the monitoring
facilities (Recommendation 3 of the Report) will be handled.
