MEMORANDUM BY THE GERMAN DELEGATION

ON THE EXPORT TO POLAND OF DIRECTION FINDING EQUIPMENT

The German authorities have received an application to license the shipment $\circ \mathbf{f}$

two units direction finding equipment Tolefunken PSt 102, total value \$ 20,000, covered by Item 1501(d)(5).

The equipment works within the frequency range from 1.5 Mc/s to 25 Mc/s. One unit will be installed on the Warsaw airport, the other one on the Poznan airport. They will be used to safeguard the civilian air traffic.

It is well known that the Warsaw airport is used by many western air companies; as far as the airport of Poznan is concerned, it is used by western companies particularly during the Poznan fair.

The equipment has been developed during the years 1952/1953 and is in regular production since 1958. No technical know-how unknown to the Bloc is incorporated in the sets. All assurances against reexport and diversion have been obtained from the Polish authorities.

The German Delegation submit the case under the special policy adopted towards Poland and hope that no objection will be raised against the shipment. The German Delegation would appreciate hearing the views of Governments by June 1st, 1960.
