COORDINATING COMMITTEE
MEMORANDUM BY THE GERMAN DELEGATION
ON THE EXPORT TO POLAND OF Measuring instruments.

The German authorities have received an application for the export to Poland of:

- 2 VHF Voltmeters Type V 600 M
- Frequency range: 45..... 225 Mc/s and
200...600 Mc/s in two ranges
- accuracy of frequency $\pm 1\%$
- bandwidth 50 Kc/s
- voltage measuring range 1 μ V... 5 V logarithmic
- 10 μ V... 50 V logarithmic
- 5 μ V... 200 uV linear

including the following accessories for each voltmeter:
1 voltage divider head 1:10 type T 10 asymmetrical with
input resistance of 1 K Ω

- 1 dipol test antenna A 60 for TV-Band I
- 1 dipol test antenna A 200 " TV-Band III
- 1 dipol test antenna A 500 " TV-Band IV
- 1 dipol test antenna A 100 " FM Broadcasting band

The equipment is specially designed to test broadcasting and TV-antennas and to determine the most favourable place for their installation. They have been used for many years for these purposes.

Total value \$ 472,---.

The equipment is covered by item 1529a of the International List.

Receiver of the measuring instruments is the firm "Elektrim Polskie Towarzystwo Handlu", in Warsaw.

Though TV in Poland is rather widespread, the whole area of the country is not yet covered by TV transmitting stations. This asks for the installation of areal test equipment, to guarantee - even in distant locations - a clear reception.

Furthermore, it is intended to set up a second TV program within a not too distant future. The relevant transmitting stations will presumably work within the 500 Mc/s range, which may explain the intention of the Polish firm "Elektrim Polskie Towarzystwo Handlu" in Warsaw -- (in order to be able to answer future request) -- to dispose of equipment, in particular such, capable to indicate the 500 Mc/s area.

The fact, that as accessories dipol test antennas for TV bands I, III and IV as well as for broadcasting bands have been ordered, confirms the authenticity of the declarations, i. e. the equipment will be installed for civilian purposes only.

It may be pointed out that this equipment complies with the conditions of the Note to item 1529 (a) which had been put forward and later withdrawn by the German delegation in November 1959.

This request is submitted within the framework of the special policy adopted towards Poland. The German Authorities would like to grant the export licence and hope that no objections will be raised in the Committee.
