SUBJECT : USAF U-2 Follow-On Program

REFERENCE : SAFP-7240, dated 11 July 1956

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to summarize in the briefest form arrangements discussed tentatively with Brigadier General Fisher, Colonel Procter, and Colonel Heron for the handling of the U-2 program of the Air Force. The conversations occurred on 11 July and were partly covered by Mr. Marshall in the referenced memorandum.

2. The principal features of the proposed arrangements would be as follows:

a. The training of Air Force personnel in suppliers' plants, principally Lockheed, will be initiated and carried forward in its initial stages as presently planned.

b. As the first three Air Force U-2 aircraft are delivered in the autumn of 1956, they will be moved to [REDACTED] and the Air Force training program will be initiated there.

c. During this phase, the Air Force personnel will be attached to the 4070th Support Wing, SAC, which will continue to be a tenant on the [REDACTED]. The Base will be organized as at present.

d. On or about 1 January 1957, a new Air Force organization probably to be known as the Air Weather Reconnaissance Squadron Provisional (Fifth) will be activated at McDill Air Force Base near Tampa, Florida.

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This designation will be the cover designation for the SAC unit which will take over the U-2 aircraft.

e. Soon after the activation of this unit at McDill, the aircraft and most of the personnel of the 4670th Support Wing will be transferred physically to McDill and administratively to the new unit.

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f. Initially [REDACTED] will be the supply depot for the USAF program. About the time of the activation of the new unit, however, spares will be moved to a depot in Southeastern United States and thereafter the supply line will run through there.

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g. All Air Force personnel who will be in this program during the [REDACTED] phase will receive Agency clearances. Those assigned to the program after the activation of the new unit at McDill will have Air Force clearances under standards prescribed by the Agency as already agreed.

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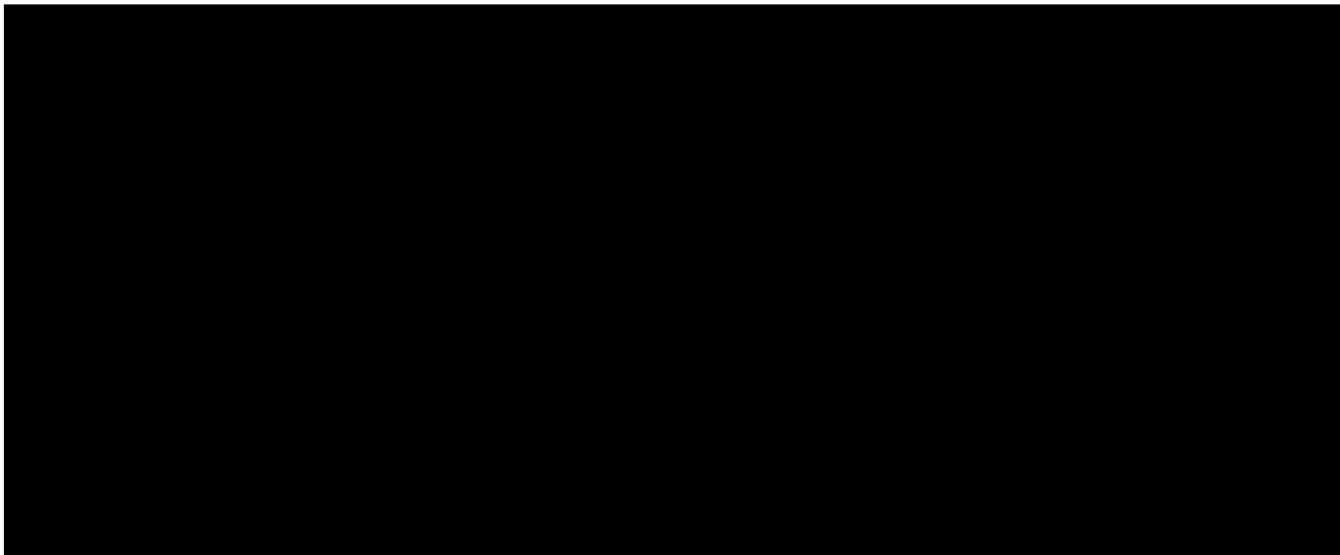
h. [REDACTED] will remain under control of the Agency to be disposed of when and as we desire.

3. These arrangements seem to me to have many virtues, the main one of which is that we are left with complete flexibility about [REDACTED]. One additional feature of the proposal is that the Air Force will be willing to carry on at McDill any training or development that we might desire to have continued there after we have closed down [REDACTED].

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5. Next week I would like to receive the comments of the addressees on this plan so that we will be prepared to discuss it with the Air Force at an appropriate time. In particular, I believe the whole matter of the maintenance of security after the activation of an Air Force unit at a regular Air Force base deserves the most careful consideration. I would appreciate the comments and recommendations of the Project Security Officer on this whole problem.
