Monthly Report for September 1958.

1. Status of Breach Projects:

30.1535 -- Industrial Capital Investment in Communist China. A memo recommending the cancellation of this project will be forwarded within the next day or so.

30.1535 -- Investment in Light Industry in Communist 25X1A9a China. I have finished reeding initial draft of this project. This was about 9% completed before he undertook the Albertan ETS assignment about 9 months ago. He feels that such of this paper is considerably cutdated and will need much additional research in order to bring it up to date. As it now stands, the report is thed in with China's raw material position. The investment requirements in light industry are related to China's ability to increase the output of essential raw materials, cotton, wool, wilk, oils and so forth. China's present "lespforward" compaign complicates this report. For example, the Chinese formerly had a 1962 goal of 2.4 million tons of cotton. A recent Chinese statement claims that the 1958 cotton crop will be about 5 million tons. Under the old 1962 goal the conclusion was justified that little additional cotton textile capacity was needed. If the new Chinese claims prove correct, the old conclusion is hardly justifiable. It is difficult at this time to explain the great and sudden increase in the cotton crop.

Hime months additional data and the complication of the "lean-forward" claims undoubtedly affect this paper. However,
