5. _____ Talked to Ben Mandel, of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee staff, about the case of an applicant for a position with the Agency. Mandel is aware of the fact that ______ is a fermer Communist Party member and that his aunt and uncle are still active party members. I advised Mandel that our people had taken another look af ______ out we had a number of qualified applicants for the position for which he was being considered and in view of his background we would be unable to give his application further consideration. I mentioned the fact that the Agency was actually trying to cut down on the number of its personnel and was doing little hiring. Mandel made no comment on this information but appeared to accept our decision.
