25X1 1. [redacted] [redacted] advised that per our
arrangement he met with the four individuals referred to us by Mr. Mace
25X1 Broide, in the office of Senator Vance Harshbarger. The meeting was held
at 3:00 P. M. yesterday. [redacted] said that the group (particularly
Mr. Richter) were most unhappy as a result of their meeting with State
Department earlier in the day. He said Richter called the White House
from his office and ostensibly made an appointment with Pierre Salinger
complaining about the State Department's attitude with respect to Cuba.
He said his meeting with the group was satisfactory and they appeared
to welcome the opportunity of talking with an Agency representative.
25X1 [redacted] merely told the group that he would see that their proposal
was passed on to appropriate people here.

25X1 2. [redacted] Jay Sourwine, Senate Internal Security
Subcommittee staff, called and asked us if we could provide the Subcom-
mittee with a "dossier" on PRATASA, a Swiss corporation which has its
headquarters in Geneva. I advised Sourwine I would check on this and
be in touch with him.

25X1 3. [redacted] Talked with Jim Hyde's office (SOB)
concerning the letter we had received from Representative Jack Westland
regarding a report from the Agency on H. R. 1845, Westland's proposal
for a Freedom Academy. (HCUA requested a report from us on this bill
last year and our reply has been in suspense pending SOB's approval of
our proposed report on a similar Senate bill, S. 822) Hyde's office indicated
that this matter still has not been resolved with the White House and Agency
reports submitted to SOB still have not been cleared. Mr. Hyde is to call
us back to provide guidance.

25X1 4. [redacted] Delivered to Mr. James J. Gehrig, in the
office of Senator Stuart Symington (D., Mo.), a blind memorandum dated
15 January and entitled Estimates of Soviet Heavy Bomber and Tanker
Strength Since 1956. A document receipt was obtained.

25X1 5. [redacted] Delivered to Miss Maureen Dentate,
Senate Armed Services Committee staff, 50 copies of Mr. McCann's
biographic outline for the Committee's use.
