At his request, I met with Marian Czarnecki, staff assistant on Mrs. Edna Kelly's European Subcommittee of the House Foreign Affairs Committee. Czarnecki indicated that in connection with their forthcoming European trip Mrs. Kelly had asked him to arrange for the Agency to brief Representative Frelinghuysen and herself on Thursday, 8 November, on the subject of Soviet oil penetration of Europe. He said Mrs. Kelly was particularly interested

Czarnecki if Mrs. Kelly and Frelinghuysen had been briefed on this recently by State. Czarnecki's reply was that they had received "several executive session briefings from State." I told Czarnecki that I would look into the matter and be in touch. Since Czarnecki and Frank Schupp, also of the Subcommittee staff, are leaving on Saturday, he asked that I make arrangements through the Committee staff.

I used this opportunity to talk with Frank Schupp about any plans which this same Subcommittee has for further hearings on the subject of Captive Nations. He said the staff is preparing a report based on the Subcommittee's hearings but there are no firm plans for the future. He said much would depend on the reorganization of the Subcommittee next February. I alerted Schupp to the fact that we had an interest in the American Committee for liberation and would be interested in any plans that might be developed which would include testimony from that organization.
