Wednesday - 12 September 1962

1. [ ] Mrs. Sykes, Congressional Relations Office of State Department, called to say Representative Charles S. Joelson (D., N. J.) had asked the Department who published the bound volumes of the [ ] I advised Mrs. Sykes that while we did not advertise this, she could inform the Congressman that the [ ] reports were put out by [ ] as one of the Agency's services of common concern. She thanked me for this information.

2. [ ] Robert Downer, Department of State, called to say that Senator Warren G. Magnuson had contacted the Department regarding a geophysical study which was being conducted by [ ] The study is being conducted as part of an agreement between the University of Washington and the government of Mexico. The [ ] have apparently gotten into some difficulty in Mexico and Downer was inquiring as to whether we had any interest in this project. After checking with WH Division and OO Division, I advised Downer that while we were aware of what the [ ] were doing, a preliminary check indicated that we had no interest in their activity.

3. [ ] General Carter, together with representatives from DOD and State Department, appeared before the joint Committees of House Armed Services and House Foreign Affairs. See Memorandum for the Record.
