1. [redacted] in accordance with a request from the office of Senator Stuart Symington (D., Mo.), provided Jim Gehrig with two copies of the "Text and Explanation of Statutes and Executive Orders Relating Specifically to The Central Intelligence Agency."

2. [redacted] in the absence of Colonel Roger M. Carter, in the office of the Secretary of Defense, advised Colonel Charles M. LeClair, of the same office, that General Cabell had signed the letter requested by the Secretary concerning [redacted] and that the letter was being forwarded directly to him that morning.

3. [redacted] Stopped by the office of Senator Wayne Morse (D., Oreg.) and discussed briefly with Joanne Johnson, of the Senator's staff, the [redacted] matter after ascertaining that the Senator had not communicated with his office concerning his date of return from South America. (See Journal of 23 January.) It was the Senator's intention to return immediately upon the close of the OAS Conference.

4. [redacted] Received a call from [redacted] GCR Graphics, indicating that they desired to make stills from the original of the [redacted] film and would need one week from the time of approval. They are ready to return a copy of the film immediately.

5. [redacted] Talked with [redacted] who had been referred by Representative Hale Boggs through Henry Wilson in the White House to the Agency. Basically, [redacted] His papers are being processed and Henry Wilson is being advised. He suggested I also advise Boggs which I shall do.
