1. [] FE, telephoned requesting information on the Walter resolution and whether or not this could provide relief for Tibetan refugees.

2. Called Representative Walter H. Judd's office attempting to make an appointment to see him. His office is to call back.

3. Talked with [] to inquire if he possibly had any information as a result of his trip to Russia which might assist in our psychological assessment of Khrushchev. He indicated he did not have such information.

[] id request the Agency to determine if it could provide unclassified material relating to radioactive isotopes in the biomedical field which had been made available by Soviet Russia to the satellites and any other country.

4. The DCI called on H. R. 3886 and was advised that McCabe did not want to sit in on any meetings and Merriam preferred to hold off until early next week meeting with CIA. The Director indicated he had wanted White House guidance prior to seeing Senator Mundt. The Director stated he would call Merriam. Subsequently he did and Merriam confirmed he did not see any real point in meeting with CIA until next week. The Director queried him as to whether there was any objection to raising the Freedom Commission bills before the OCB and Merriam indicated there was no reason why it should not be done.

5. Talked with Mr. Keena in Representative Emilio C. Daddario's (D., Conn.) office attempting to establish a new time for Daddario to see the DCI on the Downey case. Keena suggested the morning of 9 June. Later I learned this was not a good time for the DCI and we will try for eleven o'clock on 10 June.
