1. (Unclassified - JSW) The Director, accompanied by [redacted] and [redacted] appeared before the House Foreign Affairs Committee. A transcript was taken. Also, see Memorandum for the Record of action items.

2. (Secret - JSW) At the request of Senator Kenneth B. Keating, the Director, accompanied by [redacted] met with Senator Keating for approximately half an hour. See Memorandum for the Record.

3. (Unclassified - GLC) General Roderick, Department of Defense, called and asked if two men from the Department of Defense might sit in as observers on the Director's briefing of the House Foreign Affairs Committee today. With the Director's approval, Roderick was advised that we would have no objection. The two men are Colonel Dillender and Mr. Burnside, DOD.

4. (Unclassified - GLC) Mr. Cooper, State Department's office of Public Affairs, called regarding a Congressional constituent's inquiry they had received which asks the question where and by whom was the Cuban brigade which invaded the Bay of Pigs trained. Cooper said he had talked with the Department of Defense which could give him no information on this, but suggested he call the Agency. I advised Cooper that we did not comment on matters of this sort, but that he might wish to check with Mr. Jack Leahy in the State Department's Congressional Relations. ✓
