at his office in New York and advised him that Mr. Cord Meyer was processing out for about a month's absence from the city. I advised him further that I would be back to treat with him on his revised plan in Mr. Meyer's absence. I indicated further that I would insure appropriate review by the Agency. He thanked me very much and indicated that he would like to meet with me for lunch on Monday and would call me when he arrives in town Monday morning. (See Journal items of 30 and 31 March 1964.)

[redacted] In response to my call, Mrs. Jean Allen, Personal Secretary to Senator Eastland, advised that the Senator is back but that she would be unable to confirm a meeting time for Mr. Kirkpatrick and Mr. Warner before tomorrow morning. A tentative time for meeting was suggested at 10:30 either Thursday or Friday of this week. Mrs. Allen will advise.

25X1 7. [redacted] In response to Mr. George Murphy's request of 6 March concerning the Drew Pearson article of 5 March titled "Cobalt Ore Shipped To Red China", I furnished him with a blind memorandum to the point that shipments are not related to weapons development.

25X1 8. [redacted] Talked with Miss Eleanor Lenhart in the office of Senator John J. Williams (Delaware) indicating it was my understanding that GSA had indicated to the Senator that the Agency would be calling for an appropriate time when the Senator could see certain Agency representatives. Miss Lenhart was aware of this and a time was set for 11 o'clock on 2 April. Colonel White has been advised.

25X1 9. [redacted] Talked with John Buckley in Representative Dante B. Fascell's office and subsequently talked with Fascell in Miami in connection with [redacted] Fascell appeared very anxious to assist us on this and said he would be in touch with the Prosecuting Attorney's office.

25X1 Subsequently, Fascell advised that he had talked with [redacted] who is handling the case and established an appointment for John S. Warner to meet with him at 10:30 on Friday in Miami. 25X1
