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Organization - ICAPS

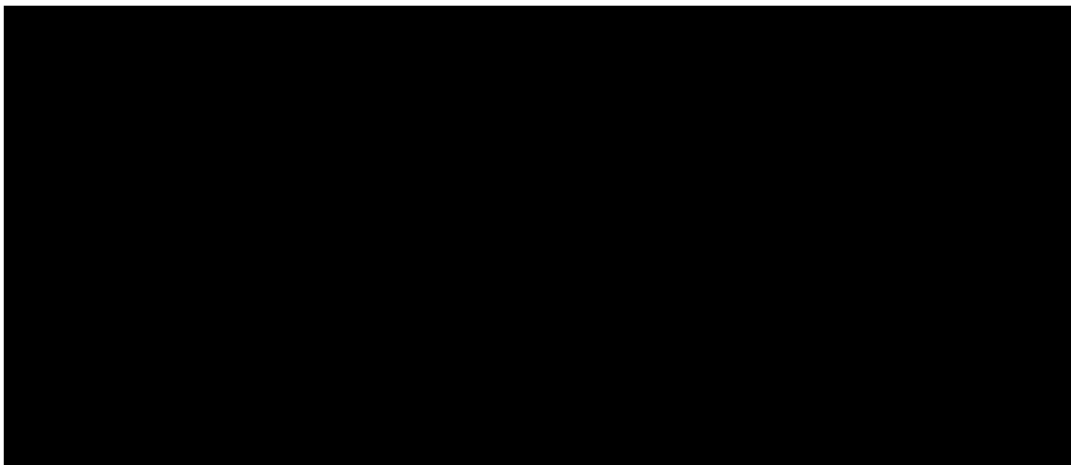
1. In order that the functions and responsibilities of the ICAPS and its relation to the other offices of the CIG may be clearly understood by all concerned, the following instructions are issued in amplification of the Tentative Organizational Chart, dated 12 July 1946:

2. The ICAPS acts for the Director in the coordination of all intelligence activities related to the national security and in order that this mission can be fulfilled, it is essential that all matters pertaining to interdepartmental coordination be forwarded to that Office for review and preparation of final recommendations to the Director.

3. In discharging its responsibilities, ICAPS will maintain continuous supervision of the planning and coordination of the intelligence activities of the CIG. Consequently, it must be kept informed of action taken on pertinent matters by the various offices of CIG and is authorized to direct these offices to conduct such surveys and to take such action on related matters as it may deem advisable to assure the most effective accomplishment of the national intelligence mission. Such direction in each case will be forwarded through the Executive Office.

4. The responsibilities for establishing and coordinating procedures for CIG liaison with participating departments, properly being a function of ICAPS, the Departmental Liaison Division of the Executive Office is hereby terminated and the responsibilities of that Office transferred to ICAPS.

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① To the end that the Interdepartmental Coordinating and Planning Staff ^{acting for the Director,} may fully discharge its designated responsibility to maintain continuous supervision of the planning and coordination of the intelligence activities of the Central Intelligence Group, the Executive Director, after ~~the~~ appropriate review for administrative coordination,

will refer to the Interdepartmental Coordinating and Planning Staff all proposed ^{procedures} policies and plans originating in ~~the~~ ^{all} Offices of ~~Special~~ ^{CIG} Operations, Collection, Research and Evaluation, and Dissemination, ~~the ICAP~~ for overall planning and policy coordination. **I II**

② In conducting ^{its studies} ~~the activities~~ of the coordination of the intelligence activities of the State, War, Navy, and other governmental agencies and individuals, the Interdepartmental Coordinating and Planning Staff,

~~through the departmental liaison hereinafter granted it, will be free~~ to correspond and otherwise ^{maintain direct} liaison with the various intelligence agencies of the Government and with individuals. When in its work ~~it~~ ^{it requires} requires the support of the Offices of ~~Special~~ ^{Operations} Operations, Collection, Research and Evaluation, or Dissemination, it will address its requests ^{for} studies, and other forms of collaboration to those offices, through the Executive Director for administrative coordination.

④ The Interdepartmental Coordinating and Planning Staff will make available the necessary ~~contacts and facilities, including office space,~~ ^{space} for such special liaison officers as the other agencies of the Government ~~may require.~~ ^{may be designated by}

③ The duties and responsibilities assigned to the Departmental Liaison Division of the Control Branch of the Executive Office, as set forth on page ___ of the Organizational Chart, dated ____, are hereby separated into two sections: one, those pertaining to departmental liaison ~~to~~ ^{to} intelligence activities; and, two, those ~~relating~~ ^{pertaining} to administrative and budgetary activities. All departmental liaison ^{relating} to intelligence activities will be ~~the responsibility~~ ^{maintained by} of the Interdepartmental Coordinating and Planning Staff.
