Waiting for All the Evidence

It's astounding the number of the anti-Castro military landings dead cats being tenderly laid rests with Mr. Dulles through the to rest at the door of Allen CIA.

At all times the President is responsible for the official actions of his executive subordinates. In addition, it would seem incredible that President Kennedy would okay U.S. participation in the Cuban landings without prior consultation with Mr. Dulles. Before damning Mr. Dulles and the CIA on one hand, it might be wise to allow the first clouds of recrimination to pass over and then make judgments based on facts.
