[] Logistics, called and said that an individual in which we have an interest has been requested by Senator Dodd to testify before the Special Subcommittee on Juvenile Delinquency concerning gun legislation. I later informed [] that Mr. Houston had already been alerted to this fact and that [] would be in touch with Senator Dodd to indicate that there were some sensitive areas upon which he should not be requested to testify. 25X1 3. [] Delivered to Senator Abraham Ribicoff's office letter concerning a former Agency employee, [] 25X1 [] Also picked up what supposedly is a new cipher code recommended to the Senator by a constituent. This will referred to appropriate Agency officials. 25X1

25X1 4. [] Talked with Miss Mary Jo Godfrey, in the office of Senator Robert F. Kennedy (D., N. Y.), concerning a former employee interested in re-employment. Informed Miss Godfrey that Mr. [] 25X1 [] had applied for employment in September and October 1964, and in both instances, we were unable to locate a suitable vacancy. I also confirmed that he had recently visited our downtown recruitment office and that his application was now being reviewed. In response to Miss Godfrey's inquiry regarding his chances, I said that this could not be determined until the current review had been completed, but that it is doubted whether there has been any significant change in our vacancy situation since he last applied.
