# General Bobadilla Of Chile Is Welcomed

A black-tie dinner given by the Air Force Chief of Staff and Mrs. Thomas Dexter White topped a busy day yesterday for the visiting Commander in Chief of the Air Force of Chile, Maj. Gen. Dario Bobadilla.

The Whites entertained for about 70 guests in the Officers Club of the Bolling Air Force Base, the group including members of Gen. Bobadilla's staff who came with him to the United States.

Earlier, the visitor was the guest of honor at an assembly of the Inter-American Defense Board at 2600 Sixteenth street N.W. and, at noon, was honored at a luncheon at the Carlton Hotel given by Gen. Lemuel C. Shepherd, jr., chairman of the IADB.

**Chile's Delegation**

Among those accompanying Gen. Bobadilla to the assembly were Mr. Alberto Diaz, alternate representative of Chile to the Organization of American States; Brig. Gen. Evaristo Gomez, chief of finance of the Chilean Air Force; Col. Humberto Zamorano, chief of the Chile-delegation to the IADB, and Col. Osvaldo Croqueruille, Chilean Air Force Delegate.

Others included Lt. Col. Bernardo Vera, chief of maintenance-engineering; Lt. Col. Walter Hietman, staff officer, and Maj. Manuel Villalobos, all from the Chilean Air Force, and Col. William Calhoun, chief of the United States Air Force Mission to Chile.

The luncheon guests included chiefs of delegation to the IADB and ranking officers of the board.

The *Charges d'Affaires* of Chile, Senor Horacio Suarez, was a guest at the Whites' dinner last night, and others attending from the embassy were the Military Attache and *Staff* de Zamorano and the Air Attache and Senora de Croqueruille.

Others on the guest list included Mr. Joseph A. Silberstein of the Chilean desk of the State Department, and Mrs. Silberstein, and a number of Air Force officers and their wives.

Among the latter were Lt. Gen. Donald W. Pugh, with Mrs. Pugh; Lt. Gen. John A. Sanford, with Mrs. Sanford; Mrs. Charles E. Cabell, wife of the Deputy Director of the Central Intelligence Agency, and Lt. Gen. and Mrs. William H. Tunner.
