This is to confirm our telephone conversation of  
17 September 1965.

The purpose of the dinner meetings is primarily  
to broaden the backgrounds of our senior employees and  
"young turks" in DD/S&T. As you can appreciate, many  
of these individuals have entered the Agency rather  
recently and have relatively little perspective on in-  
telligence, although they are qualified in science and  
technology. Your involvement in the development and  
exploitation of the first major technological collection  
system places you in a unique position to describe the  
difficulties and pitfalls in such a program.

The first meeting is planned for 6 p.m. on 12 October  
unless you wish to change it to 11 October. There will  
be a short cocktail period followed by dinner. You may  
wish to speak for thirty to sixty minutes which would  
permit additional time for discussion and a question

**MEMORANDUM FOR:** Deputy Director for Science and Technology  
**SUBJECT :** Monthly Dinner Meetings/DD/S&T

1. To follow up on our earlier meeting, I propose that the dinner meetings be held monthly from September through June with no more than thirty individuals attending. The attendees should include a few senior DD/S&T officials as well as new and younger employees. Plans have been made to take care of the administrative details in ORD. I prefer to inject more informality and thoughtful exchange into the meetings by shortening the cocktail hour, doing away with specific seating arrangements, and circulating a short resume of the speaker's background and interests prior to the meetings.

2. The speakers will generally fall into three categories:

a. Scientists and engineers who have had intimate exposure to intelligence. Suggested speakers are Dr. Land, Dr. Tordella, Dr. Killian, Dr. Weisner, Dr. Suits, Dr. Kistiakowski, Dr. Hornig, Dr. Seitz, Dr. Baker, Dr. Purcell, Dr. Tuckey, Dr. Doty, and Dr. Garwin.

b. Past and present key intelligence figures to include Mr. Kent, General Carter, Mr. Dulles, Mr. Helms, General Carroll, Mr. Fitzgerald, Mr. Bissell, [redacted]

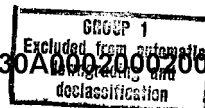
c. Non-scientists who have been or should be associated with the development of intelligence. These include Mr. Bundy, Mr. Webb, Mr. Welsh (National Space Council), senators and representatives who are responsible for appropriations, and stimulating individuals such as Senators Jackson, McCarthy, and Rep. 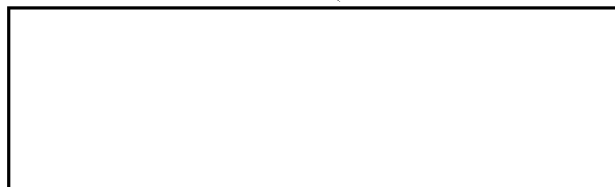



**BIOGRAPHIC DATA**

HAYDEN, CARL (Senate, D-Arizona). Hayden's Ferry, Arizona. 2 October 1877. Attended Stanford University. Elected to U.S. Senate, 26; re-elected in 32, 38, 44, 50, 56, and 62.

RUSSELL, RICHARD B. (Senate, D-Georgia). Winder, Georgia. 2 November 1897. Graduated Gordon Institute, Barnsville, Ga. 1915; B.L., University of Ga. 1918; LL.D. Mercer Univ. 1957. Mem. Ga. House of Rep. 1921-31; speaker of House, 1927-31; elected Gov. of Ga. 31-33; elected to U.S. Senate 1932 to fill vacancy, has been senator continuously since. Mem. Senate Appropriations Com., Com. Space and Aero Scis, Joint Com. Atomic Energy.

YOUNG, MILTON R. (Senate, R-North Dakota). Berlin, North Dakota. 6 December 1897. Attended N. Dakota State Agricultural College and Grace-land College in Lamoni, Iowa. Elected to full 6-year terms in the Senate, 50, 56, and 62. Served as secretary to Senate Republican Conference Com. since 48; second ranking Republican mem. of Appropriations Com. and Agriculture and Forestry.

SALTONSTALL, LEVERETT (Senate, R-Massachusetts). Chestnut Hill, Mass. 1 September 1892. A.B. Harvard College, 14; LL.D. Harvard Univ. Law School, 17. Mem. Massachusetts House of Reps. 23-36; speaker of House 8 years. Gov. of Mass., 38; re-elected 40 and 42; elected to U.S. Senate 44 for unexpired term of H.C. Lodge, Jr.; re-elected in 48, 54, and 60.

MAHON, GEORGE H. (House, D-Texas). Haynesville, La. 22 September 1900. B.A. Simmons Univ., 24; LL.D., University of Texas, 25; attended Univ. of Minn., 25; honorary LL.D. 51, Waynesburg College, Pa.; honorary LL.D. 60, Wayland College, Lubbock, Texas; honorary LL.D. 64, Hardin-Simmons University, Abilene, Texas. Elected district attorney 24, 30, 32; received Am. Pol. Sci. Assn. Congressional Distinguished Serv. Award in 63; elected 34 to Congress and re-elected to each succeeding Congress. Became Chmn. of Appropriations Committee of House in 64, continuing in that capacity in 89th Congress.

LIPSCOMB, GLENARD P. (House, R-California). Jackson, Michigan. 19 August 1915; Attended Univ. of Southern Calif. and Woodbury College. Former senior partner in Los Angeles public accountancy firm of Lipscomb, Hahn & Brown; elected to Calif. Legis. in 47 and re-elected in 48, 50, and 52; elected to 83rd Congress at special election in 53; re-elected to the 84th through 89th Congresses.

BOW, FRANK T. (House, R-Ohio). Canton, Ohio. 20 February, 1901. Attended Ohio Northern University. Awarded honorary LL.D. Ohio Northern University, 61; LL.D. (honorary) Mount Union College, 63; regent, Smithsonian Institution; elected 82nd Congress, 50; re-elected 83rd through 89th Congresses.

ANDREWS, GEORGE WILLIAM (House, D-Alabama). Clayton, Alabama, 12 December, 1906. Graduated University of Alabama, LL.B., 1928. Is a lawyer by profession. Elected to the 78th Congress to fill a vacancy caused by the death of Henry B. Stengall; serving on Com. on Expenditures in Executive Depts., Roads Com. and Com. on World War Veterans' Legislation; re-elected to the 79th and 80th Congresses, serving on Appropriations Committee and Independent Offices; re-elected to the 81st through 89th Congresses.
