25X1	7. Picked up and sent on to a copy of the continuing resolution for appropriations which is being debated on the floor today. There were numerous overall restrictions which would be applicable to the Agency's 1968 appropriation if this were to become law. Present thinking on the Senate side is that they will not accept many of these restrictions.	25X1
25X1	8. Talked with Hugh Durham, Department of Justice, who has been dealing with the Congress on the wiretapping bills. He read me the Committee Print of the bill as it now stands and the agreed on Justice/CIA/NSA language is not included. Durham indicated that Justice does not wish to debate specific language changes since this is not an Administration bill, but had no objection if a member wanted to get it included either in Subcommittee or full Committee. He had not heard of any move to require judicial procedures for the national security exception and did not think this would be accepted because of the general trend to ease restrictions rather than tighten.
