25X1 1. [redacted] Accompanied two members of the Office of Security who conducted a sweep of the hearing room for Special Investigations Subcommittee, House Armed Services, room 2337, Rayburn House Office Building. Mr. Blandford, the Chief Counsel, noted the Chairman's appreciation for the Agency assistance.

25X1 2. [redacted] Talked to Senator Eastland concerning the hearing which he may hold next week to further consider S. 1035. I noted that the Director would like to appear if this is satisfactory to Senator Eastland. He indicated that he would be happy to have the Director appear. Eastland said that the plans do not call for a hearing on S. 1035, but that he had indicated to [redacted] that he would be glad to assemble the committee in order that they might hear our objections.

25X1 3. [redacted] Talked to Garner J. Cline, Counsel, House Subcommittee on Immigration and Naturalization, concerning the outcome of the hearings on the Rodino bill. Cline said the hearing had gone very well and that all the technical questions had been answered and that he expects the bill to be reported favorably to the full Committee on the 13th of September, and reported out of the full Committee on the 19th of September.

25X1 4. [redacted] Advised Bill Morell that the Director did not wish any attribution to the Agency in the forthcoming Joint Economic Committee study and requested John S. Warner to check this out with our Committee Chairmen.
