Red Infiltration Takes New Turn

Kremlin Policy of 'Parliamentary Conquest' Outlined by CIA Chief

Washington, Sept. 1 (AP)—The nation's intelligence chief warned today that Italy, France and Indonesia are the main targets of new Communist infiltration tactics devised by the Kremlin.

Allen W. Dulles, director of the super-secret Central Intelligence Agency, described the new Red strategy as being that of "parliamentary conquest" in which the Reds try to infiltrate and take over legislative systems of free world nations.

His views were made public by the House Un-American Activities Committee which is conducting a study of new Soviet cold war techniques.

DULLES, in a statement submitted to the committee, said the new Kremlin policy was spelled out by Communist boss Nikita S. Khrushchev in a speech before the 20th party Congress in Moscow this February.

The CIA director quoted Khrushchev's remarks and said: "Translated into a little less flamboyant language, this

means that the Communists propose to infiltrate our free legislative systems, to take over our parliamentary governments and to use the freedom which our system of government gives to destroy all vestiges of that system."

He said that a few years ago he believed the Communists would have difficulty gaining allies among non-Communists in free world legislatures.

Dulles then warned: "Today, however, the danger of parliamentary compromises with the Communists, even in Europe, is not to be ignored. In Asia, this threat is even greater because it is generally less well understood."

He continued: "The Communists see their greatest opportunities where they now have the strongest penetration into the parliamentary machinery of free governments. In several countries, these penetrations are serious."
