

ARTICLE IN DANISH COMMUNIST NEWSPAPER CONNECTS
CIA WITH POZNAŃ RIOTS

An article, a full column long, entitled "Averell Harriman's Dictatorship or Socialist Democracy?" written by Danish Communist author Kai Moltke and published by Land og Folk, Copenhagen Communist daily, in its issue of 7 July, said that the CIA was behind the Poznań riots, and quoted the New York Herald Tribune to the effect that the annual budget of the CIA may exceed one billion dollars. The article stated further that the CIA is controlled by a group of big financiers appointed by President Eisenhower.

The article went on to say that following "the stinging defeat of the 17 June 1953 Berlin provocation," the CIA was the object of rather severe criticism in the US, resulting in the appointment of a special committee, headed by General Mark Clark to look into the agency. The article also said that David Sarnoff had been appointed by President Eisenhower in 1955 to make plans for carrying forward the cold war.

Since the CIA and David Sarnoff selected Poland for new experiments and continuation of the cold war, said the article, the name of Robert A. Lovett, as a member of the Eisenhower committee for the CIA, should be noted, because Lovett and his partner, Averell Harriman, had vast financial interests in pre-war Poland.

"In the Polish people, the lessons of Poznań will strengthen the struggle for Socialist democracy, since it is becoming more and more clear that the alternative is the control of Polish natural resources by Averell Harriman & Co.," the article added.

The article was illustrated with pictures of Allen Dulles, David Sarnoff, and Averell Harriman.
