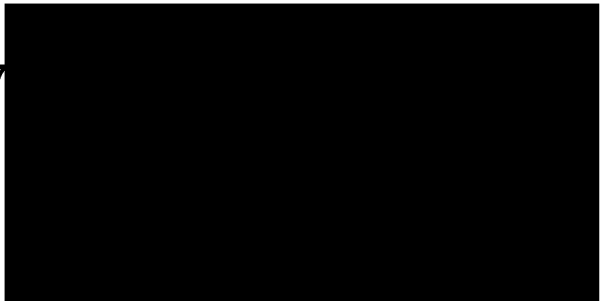

DULLES -- WITH SOVIETS (A16)

ATLANTA, OCT. 23 (UPI)-ALLEN DULLES, FORMER HEAD OF THE CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY (CIA) SAID YESTERDAY THE NEW SOVIET REGIME WOULD CONTINUE A POLICY OF TOUGH TALK.

DULLES, SPEAKING AT A REGIONAL MEETING OF THE AMERICAN BAR ASSOCIATION SAID HE HAD SPENT SEVERAL DAYS READING OUSTED SOVIET PREMIER KHRUSHCHEV'S PAST SPEECHES IN WHICH HE REVEALED HIS "PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE" POLICY AS ACTUALLY A TOUGH ONE.

DULLES SAID KHRUSHCHEV TOLD A YOUTH CONGRESS LAST MONTH, "YES, WE ARE FOR PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE OF STATES WITH DIFFERENCE SOCIAL AND POLITICAL SYSTEMS BUT WE ARE AGAINST PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE OF HOSTILE CLASSES."

DULLES SAID KHRUSHCHEV DENOUNCED AMERICAN "IMPERIALISM" AS AN "INTERNATIONAL GENDARME" AS RECENTLY AS LAST MONTH.

"WE HAVE NO REASON TO BELIEVE THAT KHRUSHCHEV'S SUCCESSORS WILL CHANGE THIS POLICY," HE ADDED.
