the Prudential Insurance Company at Newark, New Jersey maintains an index of over 12,000. The cards; the Federal Bureau of Investigation index contains in excess of 20,000,000 cards. These two organizations, as well as all others visited, conduct manual searches of their indices and race precisely the same problem presented to us; namely, that of developing and implementing a mechanical means for quicker searches. None of the organizations as yet has found an answer to this mutual problem. Civil Service Commission has contracted for two consultants from a data processing machine manufacturer to study this problem. Through the fine auspices of the Records Management Staff, we have received the full benefit of the experience of the companies and departments visited and can be assured through future liaison that we will receive the benefit of their studies and research.

- 5. As of this date, it is obvious to me that automation is the ultimate answer to a more efficient and economical operation of our indices. In the meantime, however, it is planned to effect mechanical modernization of our indices by utilizing Rol-Dex type equipment. The experience of organizations using this type of equipment has been highly satisfactory. We are also scrutinizing present work procedures involving the indices with the anticipated end of achieving substantial streamlining.
- 6. I shall advise you periodically of our progress with this problem.
