The actual transcript was sent forward to Mr. Marcy. Apparently, Senator Fulbright had the strong feeling that Admiral Raborn had flatly refused to answer a question on this and was disturbed that Admiral Raborn had, in effect, answered the same question on national television yesterday. The transcript does show that Admiral Raborn at a later point in the hearings specifically informed the Chairman that as a	
matter of policy the Agency did not utilize the Fulbright exchange program.
