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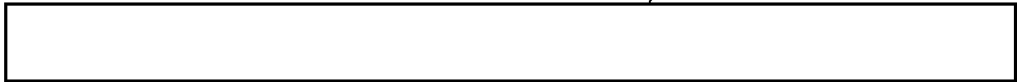

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MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Summary of Principal Subjects Discussed with Pincus and Paul.

LEADS

1. USAID

USAID Director described history of the agreement in 1962 to furnish MAP to the Royal Lao Government. Specifically noted was that the United States Government had agreed to support the Government of National Union after a request by the government which had the approval of the entire RLO cabinet including the Pathet Lao elements.

2. USIS

USIS briefing consisted of a description of country plan, including assistance to Ministry of Information such as the Lao Photo Sheet and radio programming. Aside from questions on detail, one brief principal question was: "How did the current relationship between USIS and the Ministry of Information start?"

3. ARMA

Questions dealt with composition, function and history of the ARMA presence in Laos, including the genesis of "404".

4. DEPCHIEF

Subjects of questions included "404", "Peppergrinder", status of H-34's, relationship of Depchief to USAF, genesis of the B-Team program, Thai motivation for supporting the B-Team, reason for our desire to phase out B-Team, and a description of U.S. and Third Country training.

5. Air Support

Among the few questions asked were a request for clarification of the relationship between Continental

and whether or not Peppergrinder aircraft are really USAF.

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6. AIRA

AIRA was asked the following questions: when the B-Team and armed reconnaissance began, if we gave any quid pro quo when we asked for and were given authority by the Lao to bomb the trail, when MSQ was put in place, deployment of AIRA personnel, utilization of the B-team, who services TACAN and MSQ, the loss of men in early 1968 at Site 85 (Phu Pha Thi), on what basis we have authority over the B-Team, and specific questions regarding AGM 45, Combat Skyspot, MSQ and enemy helicopter sightings.

7. USAID/RO

Questions were asked regarding general support level and composition, training, ammunition usage, FAR troop strength, usage of M-16 and details of RO organization throughout the country.

8. USAID/Luang Prabang

Questions were asked regarding American and general population figures in Luang Prabang, refugees, and the draft system.

9. AIRA/Luang Prabang

Questions were asked regarding the AIRA staff at Luang Prabang and the composition and effectiveness of the RLAF in Luang Prabang.

10. USAID/RO/Luang Prabang

RO was quizzed on his organizations and problems of transporting supplies to Luang Prabang.

11. AIRA/Savannakhet

Numerous questions were asked of AIRA/Savannakhet, touching on most areas of activity in that region, including: FAC procedures, problems of validation in Steel Tiger; details of Commando Skyspot, "Viking", and "Invert"; SAR operations, including coordination procedures and methods of recovering aircraft; PL propaganda on USAF downings; RLAF utilization and misuse of C-47s; USAF sortie rate against the Trail; the general security situation in MR III; USAF support for FAR; life under the Pathet Lao; TACAN sites, particularly Channel 72 on the Bolovens and Site 77 at Muong Phalane, which was over-run in December 1967 with two U.S. killed; and Air American weather and radio sites.

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12. ARMA/Savannakhet

ARMA was queried on the procedures for issuing ammunition.

13. USAID/Savannakhet

USAID was queried in detail on American personnel in an attempt to determine

14. USAID/RO/Savannakhet

He was asked about misappropriation of equipment and supplies, the source of POL for South Laos, and reactions by the Lao to the acquisition of the M-16.

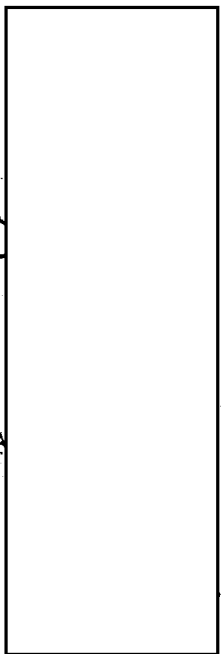

SUBJ: STAFFDEL PINCUS AND PAUL

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1. PINCUS AND PAUL ARRIVED VIENTIANE EVENING JULY 26 FROM BANGKOK. THEY SPENT EVENING AT COUNTRY TEAM DINNER HOSTED BY AMBASSADOR WHERE THEY WERE GIVEN REVIEW OF USG PROGRAMS HERE AND OVERVIEW OF COUNTRY SITUATION, INCLUDING SECURITY BRIEFING. MORNING OF JULY 27 STAFFDEL HAD WORKING BRUNCH WITH USAID DIRECTOR AND RECEIVED DESCRIPTION OF USAID PROGRAMS IN LAOS. THAT EVENING THEY HAD WORKING DINNER WITH

2. JULY 28 THEY ATTENDED COUNTRY TEAM MEETING AND RECEIVED BRIEFINGS FROM USIS, ARMA, DEPCHIEF, USAID/AIR SUPPORT, AIRA, AND USAID/RO. JULY 29 STAFFDEL INSPECTED AIR AMERICA/USAID FACILITIES AT WATTAY AIRPORT, OVERFLEW NAM NGUM DAM SITE AND BAN THALAT WITH USAID CDA LORING WAGGONER, AND THEN FLEW TO LUANG PRABANG WHERE THEY RECEIVED BRIEFINGS FROM REGIONAL USAID, USAID/RO, ARMA, AND AIRA REPS AND VIEWED RLAF FLIGHTLINE AND COC.

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3. JULY 30 DELEGATION FLEW TO SAVANNAKHET WHERE PREVIOUS DAYS LUANG PRABANG PROGRAM WAS REPEATED, WITH ADDITIONAL VISIT TO USAID/RD-RUN ENGLISH LANGUAGE SCHOOL FOR LAO MILITARY. JULY 31 WAS SPENT AT FINAL COUNTRY TEAM MEETING AND FINAL DISCUSSIONS [REDACTED] EMB, POLYMIL, AND AMBASSADOR. PINCUS AND PAUL DEPARTED VIENTIANE THAT AFTERNOON.

4. DOCUMENTS REQUESTED BY PINCUS AND PAUL INCLUDED:

- A. MILITARY SUPPORT BUDGETS FOR FY69 AND FY60 (SECRET);
- B. FIGURES ON US AND THIRD COUNTRY TRAINING FOR LAO MILITARY FROM DEPCHIEF (CONF);
- C. USAID MEMO ON PATHET LAO (UNCLASSIFIED);
- D. EXCHANGE OF LETTERS REGARDING USE OF THAI T-28 PILOTS IN LAOS (B-TEAM) (CLASSIFICATION UNKNOWN). FIRST TWO SETS OF DOCUMENTS WERE SEEN BY PINCUS AND PAUL AND HAVE BEEN SENT ON TO THEM IN WASHINGTON VIA ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE FOR CONGRESSIONAL RELATIONS. THIRD SET WAS GIVEN TO STAFFDEL WITH ADDITIONAL COPIES BEING FORWARDED DIRECTLY TO THEM. FOURTH SET OF DOCUMENTS IS NOT AVAILABLE HERE.

5. BASED ON THEIR LINES OF QUESTIONING AND REMARKS PINCUS AND PAUL WERE MOST CONCERNED ABOUT:

- A. US COMMITMENTS TO RLG, WRITTEN OR UNWRITTEN, IN RETURN FOR RIGHT TO BOMB IN TRAIL AREA;
- B. SUBSTANCE OF AGREEMENTS AMONG THAI, LAO, AND US REGARDING THAI DEPLOYMENTS IN LAOS, EG, SIERRA ROMEO AND B TEAM, AND OTHER FORMS OF THAI SUPPORT;
- C. EXTENT AND DETAIL OF US INVOLVEMENT IN LAOS (E.G., FAC PROGRAM, 404);
- D. EFFECTIVENESS OF US CONTROL AND COORDINATION PROCEDURES BOTH IN-COUNTRY AND AMONG AMERICAN MISSIONS IN VIENTIANE, SAIGON, AND BANGKOK;
- E. EFFECTIVENESS OF RLG EFFORTS TO HELP THEMSELVES.

6. VISITORS GAVE CLEAR INDICATION AT END OF STAY THAT THEY WERE PLEASED WITH ARRANGEMENTS, FULLY SATISFIED WITH BRIEFINGS AND RESPONSES TO THEIR QUESTIONS, AND IMPRESSED WITH QUALITY OF AMERICAN COORDINATED EFFORT IN LAOS. PINCUS NOTED HE AND PAUL WERE



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ABLE TO BE MORE AT EASE HERE SINCE WE NEVER ONCE
TAPED THEIR INTERVIEWS. GP-3.
