

The Red Pattern of Revolt

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The appalling manner in which HAROLD ("KIM") PHILBY managed to hoodwink both his British superiors as well as our own CIA, and to become one of the most successful double-agents of modern times, is told in four books that have recently appeared.

Incalculable damage to the American and British cause was done by this double-crossing member of the British "upper class" who turned Communist in his youth, and betrayed not only his friends but his country. Various commentators have arrived at the conclusion that PHILBY got away with his traitorous behavior for years because so many members of the British upper crust to which he belonged were unwilling to believe the truth. They apparently concluded that one who had been educated at the proper schools, wore "the old school tie", and so on, could not conceivably be a rotter and a Russian agent. This despite various suspicions and warnings.

PHILBY is now in Moscow, to which he escaped from Beirut, Lebanon, some years ago, when the British intelligence finally woke up and got on his trail. His traitorous pals in the British Foreign Office, GUY BURGESS and DONALD MACLEAN had bugged out for Moscow some time before — thanks to warnings from him, and just ahead of the police.

BURGESS and MACLEAN are credited with tipping off the Communists to the fact that GENERAL MACARTHUR had been told not to bomb beyond the Yalu in the Korean War.

PHILBY wormed his way into our CIA, and evidently spilled much valuable information to the Kremlin. He is strongly suspected of tipping off the Soviets to our U2 flight which ended so disastrously over Russia in 1960, and caused cancellation of the scheduled EISENHOWER-KHRUSHCHEV conference in Paris.

He admits sabotaging an ambitious plan of the CIA to start a revolt in Albania, which ALLEN DULLES, CIA director at that time, hoped would spread throughout the satellite states in a chain reaction. Hundreds of Albanians were apparently killed by the Communists as they rose in revolt.

The fact that PHILBY, BURGESS and MACLEAN managed to operate for years close to the centers of U. S. and British secret intelligence is a commentary on how hard it is to awaken some people to what is going on.

And right now, with campuses exploding into virtual anarchy in this country and other parts of the world, the reluctance of

various high placed persons to see any connection between these synchronized uprisings and the international Communist conspiracy, is dismaying.

Consider the following from Dr. LOGAN WILSON, head of

the American Council of Education, and former president of the University of Texas, in an interview with *U. S. News & World Report*:

There's been an extreme reluctance in academic circles — and I include college presidents and other administrators in this group — to attribute this unrest to any kind of Communist conspiracy, or Maoism or anything of this kind. With the vivid recollection of the McCarthy days [the late Sen. Joseph McCarthy], they don't want to get into this kind of thing any more. But more and more, recently, there are administrators and others who are beginning to think that this violence isn't the spontaneous youthful protest and what not that we might have thought — that it is guided.

The sooner all elements of the academic, community, as well as other persons in responsible positions, become aware of what is happening, not only in this country, but in many others, the better. There was extreme reluctance on the part of these same types to believe the worst about "KIM" PHILBY — i.e., that he was a traitorous, double-crossing Communist spy — until he had done untold damage to the United States, Great Britain and various other countries. The same sort of thing is going on now, but many of us are beginning to wake up. LOGAN WILSON points out.

What will it take to wake

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
