James B. Donovan Will Speak Sept. 11 To Catholic Lawyers; He Arranged Cubans' Release, Pleaded For Red Spy

dent of the Catholic Lawyers Guild, has announced that the Honorable James Britt Donovan, President of the Board of Education of the City of New York, and noted writer and lecturer, speak at a dinner following the traditional Red Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral in Ogdensburg on Saturday, Sept.

His Excellency, Bishop Thomas A. Donnellan, will preach the homily at the Mass. It will be followed by a reception at the home of Bishop Donnellan, for all of the attorneys and their wices. A dinner, at which Mr. Donovan will speak, will be held immediately following the reception.

The Red Mass is the popular name for the special celebration of the Votive Mass of the Holy Spirit in honor of St. Thomas Moore and St. Ives, patrons of the legal profession, and marking the opening of the law courts in the fall. The Red Mass is celebrated each fall in most of the larger dioceses and archdioceses in the United States.

James Britt Donovan is best known for his services as General Counsel to the Cuban Families Committee for the Liberation of Prisoners of War, which negotiated the release of twelve hundred Cuban prisoners, who sur-vived the Bay of Pigs invasion of Cuba in April, 1961.

After months of negotiations in Cuba with the Castro Government, which continued during the socalled "missile crisis," Mr. Donovan arranged the re-
