Parties to come in September are keyed to the country of Brazil.

The Brazilian embassy here is organizing a series of cultural events to commemorate the 137th anniversary of the independence of Brazil starting on September 7.

On the opening day Ambassador Moriera Salles will give a reception for Brazilian residents.

The following day there will be the opening of the exhibition of modern Brazilian paintings and engravings at the Arts Club.

It will include over 60 assembled from paintings loaned from museums throughout the country as well as from private collectors.

The 8th will also mark the official release of the book "Doorway to Brasilia", by Eugene Feldman and Aloisio de Magalhaes. That evening American writer John Dos Passos will lecture on "The Coming of Age of Brazil".

A color film on several films in Brazil will be shown on the 9th and the next day there will be a piano concert by Brazilian artist Julio Braga, who also played in Carnegie Hall.

Ending Brazil Week on the 11th will be a panel on "Economic Development: a vital necessity for Brazil" to be held at the Hall of Nations at Georgetown University.

Sponsoring the week are Ambassador Moreira Salles and Minister Haddock-Lobo, representative ad interim to the OAS council.
