

The body of a Central Intelligence Agency employe was found in a Fairfax County cemetery this morning. Police and Government agents are trying to determine if a pistol wound in the torso caused

The dead man was identified as James D. Deegan, 43, white, of 12 Austin-av. His home is just a few blocks from the Mi. Comfort Cemetery, in the 1900 block of King's Highway, south of Alexandria.

The body was found by two

workmen, Charlie Mobley and Robert Cheek, as they came to work. They told office em-ployes, who called police.
