Herman Heggen Dies; Executive With CIA

Herman F. Heggen, 55, an executive at the Central Intelligence Agency, died Monday at Arlington Hospital of heart disease.

His career in the CIA, begun in 1949, included work in the office of the Director of Central Intelligence as the Deputy Inspector General.

At his request in 1961, Mr. Heggen was reassigned to other activities. He was in charge of an employe benefit and service program at his death.

A native of New Rochelle, N. Y., he attended New York University and the Pace Institute.

In 1942, Mr. Heggen enlisted in the Army, receiving a commission in 1943. He was wounded in January of 1955 near Bastogne, Belgium, and his injuries forced his retirement from the Army in 1948 with the rank of major.

He leaves his wife, Kathryn, of 1701 North Jefferson street, Arlington, the home address; a daughter, Linda Anne, also of the home address, and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Heggen, and a brother,
