MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD:

Received on August 13, the August issue of AIR FORCE, "the Magazine of American Air Power, published by the Air Force Association; three hundred odd pages of which are taken up with a history of the Air Force. Preceding this however, there are several incidental items including, "What is New With Red Air Power", page 24. This article purports to be a summary of recent
