Reported Held in Russia **U.S. Presses for Info** on Missing Tourists

The State Department continued today to press the Soviet government for information about two missing American tourists reported under detention in a Russian border town for taking photographs.

Soviet officials have been silent on the fate of the men Mark Kaminsky, 28, of Jef. ferson Township, Mich., and Harvey C. Bennett, 26, of Bath, Me.—despite repeated inquiries.

The department said yesterday, however that another American tourist told U. S. officials he had seen Mr. Kaminsky Aug. 25 in the Intourist Travel Agency hotel at a Soviet border control point in Uzhgorod on the Czech border,

The department said the man dioted Mr. Kaminsky as saying he "was under detention for having taken a photograph." It also said a second tout ist reported he spoke to both men at a Kiev hotel Aig. 18. Aug. 18.

The last direct word from the two men, who were traveling together was a postcard received by Mr. Bennett's wife Sept. 6. In the card, dated Aug. 19 and postmarked Vinnitsa, another Soviet town hear the Czech border. Mr. Bennet word that he der, Mr. Bennet wrote that he and Mr. Kaminsky had auto trouble but planned to leave Russia in about six days.

Mrs. Bennett said last night L. Bath that she was alarmed" to hear the latest report. She added "All along, thought perhaps they were peing held. I would feel a ot better if I knew where hey are." (UPI)
