W. R. McKinley, Deputy Building Chief for CIA

William R. McKinley, 52, deputy chief of the building planning staff at the Central Intelligence Agency, died Sunday of a heart attack at Suburban Hospital, Bethesda.

A native Washingtonian, Mr. McKinley began his Government service with the Department of Agriculture at the age of 18. He moved to the Bureau of Public Roads in 1930, and worked on the Alaskan highway project.

From 1944 to 1952 he worked as a management analyst and examiner for the Federal Works Agency and the General Services Administration. He went to the CIA in 1952.

Mr. McKinley was also a member of the Society for Advanced Management and of the American Management Association.

He leaves his wife, Helen, and a son, William, of the home address, 2822 Rittenhouse street N.W. His mother, Charlotte DeVillers McKinley, lives in Sarasota, Fla.

Services were to be at 2 p.m. today at the Chevy Chase Baptist Church, with burial in Fort Lincoln Cemetery.
