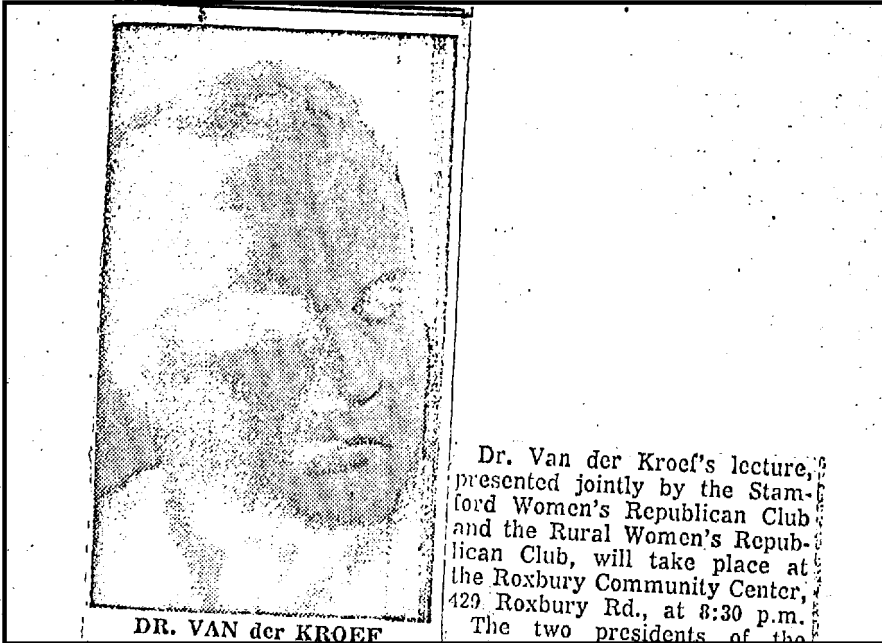

The professor, born in Indonesia, has returned to Southeast Asia on many research trips, the most recent of which was for the last six months of 1963 as visiting professor at Nanyang University in Singapore.
