PAUL DUDLEY, WROTE FOR RADIO AND FILMS
DUDLEY, Calif., May 18.—Paul Dudley, formerly of Palm Springs, a script writer for radio, television and the screen, died here Monday at the City of Hope Hospital after an illness of eighteen months. He was 46 years old. Death was attributed to a rare lung fungus disease. Mr. Dudley had written a very large number of radio scripts. He was the co-author of the book of "Solomon and Sheba," the motion picture of which Tyrone Power was acting when he died of a heart attack in Spain last Nov. 15. He had done work also for the Jack Paar television show, for the "Martin Kane, Private Eye" series, and for many of Frank Sinatra's shows. He also collaborated with Crane Wilbur and Anthony Veiller in writing "Monkey on My Back," a motion picture story of the life of a drug addict. During World War II he was production officer of the Glenn Miller Army Air Force Band shows. He had recently done scripts for the "O. S. S." series on Channel 7. Mr. Dudley was a native of Boston and started as a radio announcer in that city. He leaves his wife, Carolyn.
