of the speech of Sen. J. William Fulbright (D-Ark.) at the Thursday evening banquet here that wound up the newspaper publishers' convention.

Halfbright—oops, Quarterbright—oops, Fulbright (got it now) didn't use the word "surrender," of course.

He merely accused his own country of irritating the peaceloving Kremlin by fighting to save South Viet Nam from a Communist takeover, and of tempting peaceloving Red China to barge directly into that war.

We're growing war-hysterical, the Arkansan went on; and in our mounting eagerness for victory we're slighting the Great Society here at home, horrors.

Fulbright gave no weight in this speech to the fact that today's genuine, 100% ruthless imperialists are the Communists—in Russia, mainland China, Yugoslavia, Cuba—and that they are as determined as ever to bury us.

We can settle our differences with them easily—by simply surrendering to them as prescribed inferentially by Fulbright. We could have settled with Adolf Hitler in the same way, and with Kaiser Wilhelm II before that.

It is hard to imagine the U.S.A. surrendering to the Reds—meaning that Fulbright and people who think as he does are likely to be more and more unhappy in this country as the days go drifting by.
