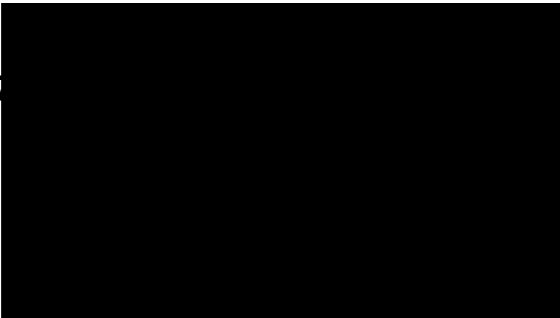

# Red Writer Finally Wins U.S. Visa

WASHINGTON — A once-barred left wing Eurasian writer has finally won her fight to obtain a visitor's visa which has enabled her to enter the United States.

She is Han Suyin, regarded as the Chinese communists' favorite propagandist, whose application to come into this country was rejected in July of last year.

The State Department in confirming that the visa had been granted said it was their understanding that it was issued on the representation that the writer wanted to confer with her publisher in New York.

JUST HOW LONG she will remain in the United States the State Department said it did not know. Her length of stay, an official of the department explained, would be up to the immigration and naturalization service. When Miss Suyin entered this country the immigration agents however made a notation on the visa as to how long she could remain here. Officials of the Washington Immigration Headquarters who would have this information were not immediately available.

It was disclosed recently that certain congressional committees had been closely watching Miss Suyin's attempts to get into this country.

Han Suyin is the pseudonym for Mrs. Elizabeth Comber, a British subject, residing in Hong Kong. Intelligence agents have labeled her a "constant" visitor to the Red China mainland.
