

Rhodes, Greece. Funds filtered through from an "Ameri-
can intelligence agency" last month provided a delightful

resentatives" of 42 countries, mostly of Asia and Africa,

(Fund for the Republic) Hutchins; and the latest recruit
to this international circuit, John Kenneth (Affluent So-
ciety) Gallbraith.
