MALINOVSKY TODAY OPENED AN EXHIBIT "ON SPYING" AT THE NEW RED ARMY MUSEUM.

THE EXHIBIT FEATURED DOCUMENTS AND PHOTOGRAPHS DESCRIBED AS SHOWING THE ACTIVITIES OF AMERICAN AND BRITISH ESPIONAGE AGENTS.

ONE PHOTOGRAPH SHOWED A BESPECTACLED MAN BENDING DOWN BELOW A STAIRCASE. THE CAPTION SAID HE WAS RICHARD JACOB, AN AMERICAN EMBASSY SECRETARY EXPELLED FROM RUSSIA IN 1962 AFTER BEING "CAUGHT RED HANDED" IN ESPIONAGE ACTIVITIES.

BEHIND THE EXHIBITS WERE THE SHATTERED REMAINS OF FRANCIS GARY POWERS' U-2 SPY PLANE, SHOT DOWN OVER THE URALS IN 1960.

THE SOVIET FLAG HOISTED ON TOP OF THE REICHSTAG AS SOVIET TROOPS SWEEP INTO BERLIN 20 YEARS AGO ALSO WAS EXHIBITED. NEARBY WERE THE CAPTURED BANNERS OF HITLER'S ARMIES.
