

Onassis Exonerated Of Fading Ink Charge

Facts, March 20 (AP) — Examining Magistrate Louis Gojon today rejected a complaint that Aristotle Onassis, wealthy shipping magnate, used vanishing ink to sign a contract.

He found no basis for any formal charge against Onassis in connection with the case, which arose from a suit filed November 19, 1954, by Spiridon Catapodis, a greek ship broker.

He said Onassis signed a contract to pay him a large commission for intervening with Saudi Arabian authorities to get Onassis the right to haul Saudi Arabian oil in his tankers, but that the shipping magnate's signature vanished from the contract in a few days and Onassis backed out.
