U. S. Mother Gets Permit to Visit Son in Red China

Mrs. Ruth Redmond has received permission to make a third visit to her son, Hugh Francis Redmond, Jr., one of four Americans imprisoned in Communist China.

The Red Cross said here that the 65-year-old Yonkers, N. Y., woman would visit her son for two weeks in mid-October. Mr. Redmond, 43, who was in the export-import business in Shanghai, was jailed in 1951 on charges of being an "undercover agent."

Mrs. Redmond, who visited her son in 1958 and last September, asked the Red Cross last month to arrange the new visit with the Chinese Red Cross Society. As in the past, the Chinese Red Cross will arrange for Mrs. Redmond's living accommodations, travel and visits to the prison where her son is serving a life sentence.

Other Americans still held in Red China are John Thomas Downey of New Britain, Conn.; Richard Fecteau of Lynn, Mass.; and Roman Catholic Bishop James Edward Walsh of Cumberland, Md.
